## Clean Up Your Act

One of the rooms in the house that we all seem to spend more time in than we would like is the laundry room. It can be especially daunting if the room is crowded, small, dark and overflowing with clothes and cleaning products. However, there are ways to make this room more functional and less aggravating.

1. If you don't already have them, install shelves above the washer and dryer. Keep in mind, that it can be a bit difficult to reach items if the shelves are hung too high, so be sure to practice reaching over the appliances to reach products before determining how high to hang them.
2. Better yet, if you can afford the extra money, hang cabinets. Left over cabinets from a kitchen re-do or repurposed ones from a garage can be put to use. They don't have to be pretty, just functional. They are especially nice because you can close the doors to hide the contents.
3. After your shelves or cabinets are hung, determine which cleaning products you use the most in the laundry room (detergent, softener,

stain remover, spray starch, etc.) and keep only those products in the laundry room. Of course, if you need to store other cleaning products in this area, you certainly could, but be sure the laundry products fit first.

4. If you have additional space on the shelves or in the cabinets, store such items as the iron, "delicates" bags, hangers and the like.
5. If your space is extremely small, consider stackable units or even apartment size stackable units. Yes, you will need to do smaller loads, but the freedom of space will be worth it.
6. If your laundry area is in a basement or other area without much daylight, hang some pretty pictures of places you'd rather be.
7. For the dirty clothes themselves, any large hamper will do. Some people prefer to use a sorting hamper (one with separate sections for whites, colors, etc.), but it is not really necessary. However, if you have the space and want to take it to that level of detail it can be a time-saver in the long run.
8. For your ironing space, consider hanging your board from the wall or even purchasing a board that permanently mounts to the wall and is simply pulled down for use.
9. If you like to fold in the laundry room, you can sort and fold right on top of the dryer. Just be sure to keep it lint free so as not to "dusty up" your newly laundered items.
10. Finally, once your items are folded, return them to the room/closet/dresser where they belong immediately so as not to get them mixed in with the dirty items.

These ten steps will help to free up more space in your laundry room, make it easier to find the cleaning

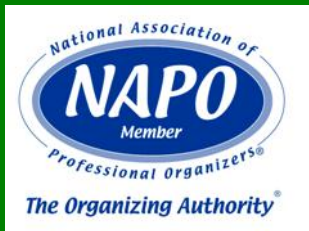
